We are all very happy and optimistic about the opportunities that will come from joining Cavendish Education and there has been a significant number of meetings in school with the various directors, finance staff and Koen from Burlington House School.

I would like to thank all our school governors for their commitment to the school, particularly our parent governors — Kris, Diane, Melanie and Ben. A special note of thanks to Anne-Catherine who was our Chair or Governors, who has been an invaluable support to the school throughout the last few years, including the challenges during the pandemic and running up to the change of ownership.

Core values

Anti-bullying week and school council

We spent a whole week looking at anti-bullying in November and the students got involved in a range of activities to improve their understanding of what constitutes bullying and the impact it can have on others.

We have brand new school council members this year with representation from across the school and I look forward to working with them and getting their ideas and insights in relation to improving the school.

Remembrance Day

A big thank you to Tom (from Neptune) for playing the "Last Post" on the terrace at 11am on Friday 11 November. It was one of those moments that gives you goosebumps and it was lovely to see such respect shown by the students and staff who were present. Also, a thank you to Ellie (Saturn class) who delivered the poem "In Flanders Fields" during Caroline's assembly – another lovely and respectful moment.

Breck Foundation

Ellie (Saturn class) presented a thought-provoking assembly to secondary students in November. Ellie is an ambassador for the Breck Foundation that was founded in 2014 in response to the tragic loss of Breck Bednar, a 14-year-old boy who was groomed and murdered by someone he met online. Ellie explained the dangers of being online through Breck's story. Ellie was amazing and delivered the session incredibly well, including fielding some very good questions from the students.

External monitoring

We have received a monitoring visit from our Autism Accreditation assessor to see how well we are maintaining our advanced autism practice throughout the school, and we had positive feedback with a few areas that need a little tweaking. Our external school improvement partner conducted a 1-day visit in November to focus on literacy in primary and to conduct some joint lesson observations across secondary with Craig and myself.

Trips and visits

There have been a wide range of trips and visits this term with two very successful football matches, a visit to a local care home from Earth students and a number of transition visits to local colleges for our older students who are planning their next steps beyond Heathermount.




This term has been busy for Elm class! We began by looking at the Ancient Egyptians in history, learning how they write in Hieroglyphs and how they mummify their dead.

Elm class have been working towards an ASDAN qualification in independence. We've been looking at personal hygiene, such as brushing teeth and cleaning ourselves.




















Willow









Beech

In history, we have been learning about Ancient Egypt.




Pine

We have had a fantastic term in Pine class, with each student showing significant progress in many areas!

In maths we have been working on addition and subtraction. We used a one hundred square to help, and even managed to count in tens from any number.

During our fine motor skill lesson on Friday, we have been copying patterns onto our peg board. At the beginning of the term, the students were unable to copy the pattern without staff help, now Pine class are able to complete this task independently.















Forest School

During this term, students have taken part in different methods of cooking.

Students cooked using a Trangia, this involved learning how to set it up and how to light it.

They have also learnt to use flint and steel to create a fire to cook on in the fire pit.







Students cooked the produce that had been grown in Heathermount grounds:

and were treated at the end of term with cooking marshmallows!








PANTOMIME






SECONDARY CHRISTMAS PRODUCTION

It was really successful and they have asked us to come back and visit them again soon!










Students in Earth also raised £58 from making Christmas cards and selling them. All money raised was used to make a Christmas hamper for the care home.




Catering

He was fully engaged and showed good teamwork.










Tom is working on his Level 2 in Food Production and Cooking unit.

WAY GODD WELL JOB DONE


There has been a lot of learning going on in maths!

They were then working on numeric reasoning with fractions, decimals and percentages, and applied these skills in real situations. Group work on problem solving was more comfortable on the floor for some.






Art

As always, the students are busy in art.

Younger, pre options students, are currently studying colour theory, saturation and value how it applies to making choices in their art. This is alongside how to use tools correctly and the history of pop art.

They are studying artists like Andy Warhol and Roy Lichtenstein as part of this course, their effect on art and the broader social changes that led to pop art becoming a major art movement.

For the options students following the bronze curriculum, they are studying different mediums of paint such as water colours and oil paints within the context of landscapes and the way each medium works, such as the way pigment transfers through fluid mediums and how it can be used in a practical context.

The silver students are planning their leadership projects, such as teaching art lessons alongside learning about qualifications and careers in art.


Students have been very busy over the term learning new skills.












English






ICT

Mercury - Creative iMedia

I am very excited to announce that this academic is the first offering of the Level 2 Creative iMedia qualification. Students achieving this qualification is a progression to working in the media industry.

For example, Film/Video Editor, Blogger, web designer.

Five of the Mercury students are pursuing this qualification.

Mercury – GCSE Computer Science

Four of the Mercury students are pursuing a GCSE in Computer Science. They are currently budding program developers and rising to the challenges of writing program solutions to a range of scenarios including quizzes and simple games.



Oxford University Computing Challenge

In November, KS3 and some KS4 students took part in the Oxford University Computing challenge.

They sat a 45-minute timed session, figuring out responses to a range of challenges.

Four students achieved top scores within the challenge category they were entered for and will be awarded with the 'Best in School' certificate...

PΕ

This term secondary students have been developing their skills in **Football, Badminton, Basketball** and Handball.

Some students have started a **sports coaching course** and are supporting the PE department in delivering lessons to the primary students. This is a credited course and will provide the students with the essential knowledge and skills to enable them to become effective coaches.

Although it doesn't seem right at this time of year, we have nevertheless been very excited by the prospect of England (and some other nations) doing well in the **World Cup**. Some students have helped put together a world cup draw for the whole school to get into world cup fever.



PSHE

In PSHE this term, Pluto class have been working through the "Desert Island" project. This project is spread over all of this term's PSHE lessons and contains a variety of knowledge to be learned, along with a plethora of skills to be acquired.

Desert Island



Pluto started off by receiving some back story to the project. After they knew what this looked like, we progressed through the different lessons. The lessons all followed the same narrative, continuously adding onto it, and learning more. We went over different interpersonal skills, and the skills necessary to work independently. We also touched on some different religions, allowing the students in the class to come up with their own, and we talked about crime, reform, and punishment.

Construction

Six students are currently working on their electrical unit in their BTECH Construction course. The students are making their own electrical circuits, which include a 13 Amp plug socket and a fuse spur. The students have opted to make a "ring main" (this is what's found in a home) as opposed to a simple circuit, exceeding the tutor's expectations. A ring main requires more technical skills and patience! The students are developing and demonstrating leadership skills, problem solving, and teamwork not to mention practical skills using a selection of tools safely.

School Business Administrator

What does your role involve?

It involves lots of different things under the heading of "general administration". My main role is to set up the annual reviews and EHCP reviews for all students across the academic year. My job role also includes work on recruitment and arranging interviews for prospective new staff. I am also responsible for making sure the timetables for students are on our database and are kept up to date and this in turn ensures that the registers are ready and correct. I am also involved with First Aid and administering medication to students.

Why did you decide to do this role?

I started working in a school almost 20 years ago in the administration function. I did work as a teaching assistant for 5 years before this, but then decided I wanted to move to the administration area of a school. I was working in a mainstream primary school and decided that I could work all year

round rather than just term time as my own family circumstances had changed. I was keen to move to a SEN school as I had previously worked with twins who had special needs and some children with reading challenges whilst in my role as a TA and found this very rewarding.

What does a typical day look like?

No two days are the same, which I actually enjoy as it means my work is varied. The first thing I do when I come in each day is to read my emails and then I generally plan my day around the priorities of those. My week is arranged around the annual reviews which are scheduled each week and therefore the administration for those has to be kept on top of.

What involvement do you have with the children in school?

I don't have as much as I used to. I am involved in administering medication to different children when this is required and once a week for those that have this regularly.

I am also a trained first aider so I will be called upon on an ad hoc basis to help where needed. Occasionally I will help with "job coaching" and assisting business administration students with putting their learning into practice.

What is the best part of your job?

When the task I am currently working on is complete I will get a sense of achievement and satisfaction in getting that done.

How does your work impact our children and families?

Each student has an EHCP which has to be reviewed each year at the annual review as this is a statutory requirement. I have to ensure all of this process runs smoothly, which includes getting all of the information to the relevant parties, and that the local authority has all the information it needs for updating.

I sometimes have to contact families for certain administrative tasks including updating addresses and contact details or advising on ad hoc enquiries.
